Funding boost gives local students access to world-class education

Four local secondary schools are set to benefit from Round Two of the Rudd Government Trade Training Centres in Schools program.

Willunga High, Wirreanda High, Hallett Cove, and Reynella East High school students will now have increased access to world-class education and training – thanks to the Rudd Government.

The Federal Member for Kingston, Amanda Rishworth said the program aims to help young people become equipped with the skills they need to effectively and competitively participate in the workforce of tomorrow.

“It addresses skill shortages in traditional trades and emerging industries by ensuring Australian students have access to high-quality relevant education and training opportunities that engage and encourage them to complete their studies”.

“The Australian Government is increasing opportunities for young people in partnership with the states and territories and the non-government school sectors.”

On 3 February 2009 the Government announced a further \$14.7 billion to build the education revolution.
